

## Meadow View Primary Pupil Premium – allocation and planned expenditure 2013/2014

The Government believes that the Pupil Premium, funding which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address some of the underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their peers. The funding is aimed to tackle disadvantage and to reach the children who need it most.

New measures have been included in performance tables of results that capture the achievement of pupils eligible for free school meals and therefore covered by the Pupil Premium.

From September 2012, schools are required to publish through their website information about how the premium has been used.

Pupil Premium 2013/14 - £102,600

The Governors have agreed to the proposed spending of the Pupil Premium funding this year;

- Behaviour for Learning Mentor
- PSA and Attendance Officer
- SMSA Reading - £6000
- Achievement for all (AfA) – No cost this year but will need funds 2014/15
- 1:1 intervention. £300 per child x 15 children = £4500
- Extra UKS2 Teacher
- EAL support from Winterhill = £2800
- £1000 maths resources
- £1000 literacy resources
- Children's university = £200.
- Extra curricular opportunities. At Meadow View we pride ourselves on the extra curricular opportunities that children have access to. We target Pupil Premium children who would benefit for extra curricular experiences and subsidise costs for after school clubs and visits.
- Breakfast Club for targeted children
- Pupil Premium TLR - £2500
