5Rs

The ethos of our school is built around five words; **Respect, Responsibility, Resourcefulness, Resilience and Reflection**; we call these our **5 R's**. These words are connected to everything we do at school; ensuring that every child reaches their own personal goals and most importantly their potential. It is our aim that every child will have the confidence and skills for their next stage of their learning journey and for their future life.

In assemblies we teach children what each of the 5Rs means in and around school. If a child is not showing one of the 5Rs they will first be given a warning and a reminder of how to rectify their behaviour. If they continue, they will move onto number 1 of the Pirate Ship plank. If they get to number 5 on the plank, parents will be informed.

So how do children stay on the Pirate Ship?
They need to follow the 5Rs. Look left to see what this means.
