## **Anti-Bullying**

Meadow View Primary School are passionate about ensuring that all pupils are safe and happy at school. We pro-actively teach children to be kind to each other and see things from each other's perspectives. We recognise however, that occasionally there are incidents where pupils may be unkind to each other. We take all of these incidents seriously and will immediately address unkindness with the children involved and teach the children how the situation could've been handled differently so that they can learn and grow. We encourage pupils to report any incidences of unkindness to staff immediately.

Bullying is extremely rare at Meadow View Primary School; however all allegations of bullying are taken very seriously and fully investigated.

The definition of Bullying is: persistent behaviour by an individual or group with the intention of verbally, physically, or emotionally harming another person or group. It can be physical or emotional and it can take many forms (e.g. cyber-bullying). Bullying can also occur because of prejudice against particular groups.

#### Bullying is generally characterised by:

**Repetition**: Incidents are not one-offs; they are frequent and happen over a period of time.

Intent: The perpetrator(s) means to cause verbal, physical or emotional harm; it is not accidental.

**Targeting**: Bullying is generally targeted at a specific individual or group.

**Power imbalance**: Whether real or perceived, bullying is generally based on unequal power relations.

If bullying is found to be happening, the school will immediately work with the perpetrator, victim and their families to immediately stop any further incidences and ensure it does not happen again. I have attached our parent friendly anti bullying policy to this email.

#### Lateness

The attendance team monitor lateness just as they do with attendance. We have seen an increase in lateness recently and will be tackling this with each family. It is vital that your child is at school before 8:45am when the gates close. If you have difficulties doing this, please speak to Mrs Morgan who will look for ways in which we can support you.

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
