Sports Days

Subsidised Trips

We recognise that the cost-of-living crisis is putting significant pressure on families and that the cost of school trips can be an additional pressure. In response, the school is now in a position to subsidise all school trips. From September 2024, all school trips will be charged at a standard cost of £5 and school will subsidise the additional costs.

Parking
