Parking

We are currently experiencing some significant difficulties with inappropriate parking on Meadowhall road and would like to request your support with this.

- If you see parking that is inside of the school keep clear zone, on single or double yellow lines or at bus stops on the main road, can you please take a photo of the registration plate and the parking and report it to the council using this link.
- If the parking is dangerous, on pavements or near junctions please take photos of the registration and parking and report it to the police using this link. If we work together, we will hopefully see an improvement.

We are also seeing an increase of unauthorised members of our school community attempting to use our staff carpark and move their vehicles during allocated drop off and collection times. In order to address this, we are extending the drop off and collection times at the end of the day. When we return from the school holidays on Monday 24th February, the gates will be closed and locked in a morning from 8:30am-9am and 3:05pm-3:35pm. We are also exploring other enforcement options available to us and may have further details about these in the future.
